Increased Access to the Greens

Club Access Guidelines

Current LLBC members with at least one full year of experience at the club may be granted access to the greens and drawshed outside of scheduled events and activities, provided they follow the guidelines below.

Please note: Access is a privilege and may be revoked if guidelines are not followed.. Members who use the greens for practice **should not expect anyone from the board or other volunteers** to be there to open and close for you.

- Shared Responsibility: All members are responsible for security, cleanliness, and proper use of all club areas.
- Sign-In/Out: Members and guests must sign in and out using the logbook in the drawshed.
- Equipment: All equipment must be cleaned, returned, and stored properly after use.
- Ground Sheets: Must be used at all times while bowling to protect the greens.
- Hours: Bowling is allowed from 10:00 AM to dusk only; lights are not to be used.
- Maintenance: Greens maintenance takes priority; vacate greens when requested by staff.
- Guests: Must sign a waiver (in drawshed) and leave it in the designated area.
- Practice: Not permitted during scheduled club events (e.g., jitneys, leagues, fun days).
- Clean-Up/Lock-Up: Remove all garbage/recycling and lock up clubhouse, drawshed, and gates before leaving.



Please Be Aware! Grounds Upgrades Underway



Over the coming weeks, you may notice some disruptions to normal access and activities as construction takes place. New concrete pads are being poured around key areas of the club to improve footing and access. These pads will also serve as the foundation for brand new shelters currently being built by local high school students—an exciting community partnership that supports both our club and youth development.

A total of twelve shelters will be installed, with four each planned for the north, west, and east sides of the greens. We expect to install four this summer and the remaining eight in the fall. Existing shelters will also be relocated to optimize space and provide better coverage during events. In addition, a permanent accessibility ramp is being constructed. This entire project is being **funded by the 2025 Horizons Grant**, which we were proud to receive this past spring.

Please be mindful of equipment and crews while work is in progress. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we continue making meaningful improvements for the benefit of our entire club community.
