

Novice TournamentTuesday, August 5, 2025New to lawn bowling? This one's for you!


In Ontario, a Novice is anyone with five years or less of lawn bowling experience. This tournament is a great way for newer bowlers to gain confidence, meet fellow players, and enjoy a friendly team competition in a welcoming environment. All skill levels welcome.

Format: First to 18 points or 10 ends, whichever comes first

This classic one-on-one competition is all about precision, focus, and smart play. It's an excellent opportunity to test your individual skills and challenge yourself on the green.

Pairs play is all about teamwork and strategy. Two players work together—one as Lead, one as Skip—to build the head and finish strong. A fun and social format for bowlers of all levels.

CLUB JITNEY SCHEDULE

A Jitney is a casual, friendly game of bowls where teams are randomly assigned by the draw shed crew. Just arrive at the club at least 15 minutes before game time, check in at the shed, and your name will be entered into the draw. No need to pre-arrange a team. It's a great way to meet new players and enjoy the sport in a relaxed setting.

OPEN BOWLING

Open Bowling is a drop-in format open to all members. There are no assigned teams or formal structure—just come when you can. You can bowl solo, pair up with others who are there, or bring your own group. It's a flexible and informal way to get in some practice, play a game, or simply enjoy time on the green.

2-4-2 THURSDAY NIGHT LEAGUE

The 2-4-2 format is a popular style of lawn bowling where teams of two take turns alternating roles each end. One player delivers the first and last two bowls, while the other plays the middle four—hence the name 2-4-2! It's a great way to build teamwork and strategy, and perfect for skips and vices. Players should have experience wth measuring and counting the head.

Bowling Etiquette

✓ Bowling Etiquette: 10 Tips for a Great Experience

Whether you're a first-time or a seasoned player, good etiquette ensures that everyone enjoys a smooth, respectful game.

Here are 10 reminders to keep in mind during tournament play:

- 1. Arrive early be on the green and ready at least 10 minutes before your game
- 2. Stay silent and still when others are delivering bowls
- 3. Stand behind the mat or head when not involved in the play
- 4. Avoid distractions no loud conversations or movements while opponents play
- 5. Be up and ready when your turn approaches
- 6. Congratulate good shots sportsmanship goes a long way
- 7. Know the rules of the format you're playing (e.g., number of bowls, ends)
- 8. Don't walk up the green until all bowls have come to rest
- 9. Keep up the pace avoid delays between ends
- 10. Be gracious in victory or defeat thank your opponent at the end of every game
